Seabirds such as Least Terns and Black Skimmers normally nest on the beach, laying their eggs on the sand.

Unfortunately, many beaches have become so crowded with people, pets and other disturbances that these birds can no longer nest there.

In response, some seabirds are nesting on flat, gravel roofs such as the one on this building.

This roof provides a place for these imperiled birds to nest and raise their chicks, helping their populations survive. Please excuse the birds as they finish nesting. We hope that you enjoy watching them produce a new generation!
