

**Black Skimmer:** Depending on the time of year, breeding, migrating, and wintering black skimmer are found in Florida. There are active skimmer banding projects throughout the US using coordinated field readable coded bands. In Florida, black skimmers are banded with green bands with white letters and numbers. The table below provides the color of field-readable band associated with each state of origin and how to report the resight.
